- "Integration" with the Big 4 plus American Ancestors, Find A Grave, Billion Graves, RootsPoint (a global community centered around the US 1940 census), Geni, WikiTree, WeRelate, OpenArch (Dutch and Belgian), GenealogieOnline (Dutch)
- DNA analysis features endorsed by Blaine Bettinger
 - Upload your matches from 23andMe, Ancestry, FamilyTreeDNA, MyHeritage, and GEDMatch
- Research aids
 - Search Hints and ToDo
 - GenSmarts suggests record collections to research based on your tree
- Web Clipper can easily add records to tree (for Chrome & Firefox browsers)
- Good charts and reports; Spectrum of privacy & sharing options



Public or private tree? Which should you choose

Public Private

- Only people you invite as editors can edit people in your tree (all plans) Only people you invite can see living people in your tree (all plans)

- Only people you invite can see DNA results and private research logs (all plans)
 - Only people you invite can see deceased people in your tree
- Requires a Pro plan

- Anyone, including search engines, can see deceased people in your tree Share discoveries on social media



FamilySearch Integration

- Selecting Hints from FamilySearch is an option
- Choosing that option results in a copy of your RootsFinder tree being stored in <u>FamilySearch</u> <u>Genealogies</u>
 - Trees in FamilySearch Genealogies can be viewed but not modified by FamilySearch users.
 - Your FamilySearch Genealogies tree will be continuously synchronized with your RootsFinder tree.






- Gold stars are sources (Plus sign indicates more than 5)

- Clicking on the name brings up the person's profile


Rootsfinder - Profile




Rootsfinder - Dashboard

Rootsfinder - Hint Settings





- Installing results in a web clipper icon on your browser page






Rootsfinder Web Clipper - Type




Rootsfinder Web Clipper - Type



Rootsfinder Web Clipper - Details







DNA Features

· "Quick and easy to set up, and you need Tier1 at GEDmatch to take full advantage of the tools (for Matching Segment Search and Triangulation tools). The import of data is remarkably fast and easy, among the fastest and easiest I've seen anywhere (just cut and paste) similar to the DNAPainter tool. " ~ Blaine Bettinger

DNA Features

- To import matches from GEDMatch, you must subscribe to the "Tier 1 Tools" (\$10/month)
- To import matches from 23andMe, Ancestry, FTDNA, and MyHeritage, you must subscribe to the DNAGedcom Client App (\$5/month, \$50/year)

DNA Features

 After uploading your matches, then color code kits by tagging them to your tree. Use color coding to identify relationship clusters.
